Preface

This Publication is designed to highlight the distinct features of all the public Primary, Junior and Senior Secondary Education in the State. It is aimed at identifying the various challenges and needs of each school and also measure Government service delivery in all the state owned schools. Having timely and reliable data in education will result in an effective planning and efficient management in decision making.

The Ministry of Education has continued to enjoy the support of the technical partner - ESSPIN (Education Sector Support Programme in Nigeria) on various capacity building on data processing and the introduction of the Graphical representation, School Directory and the Integrated School Development (ISD) Model, which identifies area that require intervention.

This report is an evident of the state administration's commitment towards the high level policy documents such as: Ten Point Transformation Agenda(TPA), Millennium Development Goals(MDGs),Ehingbeti Resolutions & Recommendations and the consolidation of these policy documents into State Development Plan. The draft report was ready by July, 2013, as scheduled due to the full participation of all stakeholders in Basic and Senior Secondary Education. The year 2012/2013 Annual School Census Report is hereby presented for policy making, planning and use of all stakeholders.

Executive summary

The School Census Report is a key planning tool in the Education Sector and is premised on data which is described as raw facts and figures. The raw data is cleansed, processed and transformed to produce accurate and consistent information required for **planning and equitable distribution of scarce resources**.

The Y2012/2013 report includes charts that give a pictorial view of the data which is a major improvement from the previous reports. A noticeable improvement is also observed in the response rate for this Census over the previous year. All public schools responded as expected making it a 100% rate. It should be noted however that, the current Census did not cover Private Schools as a result of insufficient fund. Available data for Private schools in this report therefore is the projected figures of the Y2009/2010 Private School Census. Also, unlike previous reports Y2012/2013 report captured the five technical colleges spread across the five divisions in Lagos State.

In terms of enrolment, appreciable increases were recorded particularly at the Pre-primary and Primary level, 10.3% increase was recorded while there is a slight decrease in Junior Secondary level by 5.2% a slight increment of 0.42% was observed at Senior Secondary level. The Pupil-Teacher ratio in public Primary schools increased from 1:36 in Y2011/12 to 1:43 in Y2012/13. This is largely caused by the increase in the population of pupils at that level without a proportional increase in the number of classrooms. At the Junior Secondary level, there was an increase in pupil-classroom ratio from 1:85 to 1:101 despite the decrease in enrolment. This may be due to lower transition rate from one class to the other as a result of benchmark standard (50% credit pass in core subjects) introduced, coupled with merger as a result of demolition of some schools. At the Senior Secondary level, Pupils-Classroom ratio decreased from 1:63 to 1:57 due to noticeable improvement in infrastructure.

The Student-Teacher ratio increased from 1:36 to 1:43 for Pre-primary and primary, also increased at the Junior Secondary from 1:32 to ratio 1:37 while The Student-Teacher ratio decreased slightly for the Senior Secondary from 1:28 to ratio 1:26.

The vast majority of teachers at all levels are qualified. Qualified Pre-primary teachers stood at 98%, while ninety percent (90%) of teachers at the Primary level have the minimum teaching qualification. About five percent (4.7%) of teaching and learning are held outside the conventional classrooms based on inadequacy of classrooms. At the Junior Secondary

level, 81% of the teachers are qualified, Whereas at the Senior Secondary level, 92% of the teachers possess the requisite qualification.

The available statistics shows slight improvements in the status of facilities in our schools. For example, 91% of available classrooms in the Primary school, 65% in Junior Secondary and 92% in the senior secondary level are classified useable. Approximately 52.8% of public primary schools, 63.65% of junior secondary schools and 77.08% of all senior secondary schools have access to safe water.

The toilet situation may not be pleasant yet as the Pupil-Toilet ratio at pre-primary and primary stands at 1:100 and 1:131 respectively while senior secondary ratio is 1:101. However, it is believed that results of massive efforts being put in place to provide infrastructure in our schools will start to show visibly in coming years.

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Definitions

Dropout rate by grade: Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year who are no longer enrolled in the following school year.

To measure the phenomenon of pupils from a cohort leaving school without completion, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

Gross enrolment rate: Total enrolment in primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the eligible official school-age population (6-11 years in Nigeria).

To show the general level of participation in primary education. It indicates the capacity of the education system to enrol students of that age group. It can also be a complementary indicator to net enrolment rate by indicating the extent of over-aged and under-aged enrolment.

Gross intake rate: Total number of new entrants in the first grade of primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population at the official primary school-entrance age (6 years in Nigeria).

To indicate the general level of access to primary education. It also indicates the capacity of the education system to provide access to grade 1 for the official school-entrance age population

Net enrolment rate: Enrolment of the official age group for primary education (6-11 years in Nigeria) expressed as a percentage of the corresponding population.

To show the extent of coverage in a given level of education of children and youths belonging to the official age group corresponding to the given level of education

Pupil-teacher ratio: Average number of pupils (students) per teacher at a specific level of education in a given school year.

To measure the level of human resources input in terms of the number of teachers in relation to the size of the pupil population. The results can be compared with established national norms on the number of pupils per teacher.

Repetition rate by grade: Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at given school years who study in the same grade in the following school year.

To measure the rate at which pupils from a cohort repeat a grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

Background

The National Educational Management Information System (NEMIS) Policy, which was approved by the 54th National Council on Education meeting in Katsina in December 2007, envisaged the decentralisation of the system in 2009: “different states are now required to set up, staff and furnish education management information systems for their respective states”. The Policy document determines some coordination principles (in terms of organisation, operations and the transition period). These are further explained in the Implementation Guidelines for the NEMIS Policy that was disseminated in August 2009.

The National EMIS Committee, convened in August of 2009, approved the ASC Operational Manual, which is based on a census cycle that runs yearly from August to July. The Operational Manual includes guidance for every ASC phase and a timeline. Additionally the National EMIS Committee also approved a simplified ASC questionnaire (8 pages long for the public sector) and an even shorter form for private schools (4 pages long). It was approved that the Education Sector Support Programme in Nigeria (ESSPIN) would provide a new, simple and easy-to-use data entry software designed for the newly adopted questionnaires which would be made available to all states, and lastly, November 16th was selected as the start date for the week of data collection.

This national meeting was followed up by the Lagos State EMIS Committee meeting, during which the committee decided on major changes to the way that the Lagos census would be conducted, meaning a break with past methods. In 2009 trained enumerators were used to fill in the form while sitting with the school’s head teacher, who would supply all data needed. Field coordinators were trained to organise and oversee the work of enumerators, and ensure that forms were correctly and completely filled before being returned to the SMOE and SUBEB. Additionally, a Core EMIS Committee was instituted in the state, which was responsible for planning the census, meeting several times in the months leading up to the data collection, and members were also responsible for ensuring that enumerators and field coordinators fulfilled their duties.

Forms were returned to the SMOE and SUBEB in a fairly timely fashion. Data enterers were trained in both EMIS units, and after a delay in getting the IT infrastructure operational, data entry commenced and was completed in approximately one month. Data was cleaned and data analysts were trained; capacity of data enterers and analysts was raised with the support of ESSPIN, although there is still need for more such capacity building during the coming cycle. As a result of these efforts, state officers were able to accurately generate the tables in this report. The content of these tables were checked and double-checked to ensure accuracy.

This report presents an overview of Lagos’ public school system, with the intention that this information will be used in planning across the education sector, and will cut down on the need for ministries, departments and agencies collecting their own data. As the methods for conducting this census constitute a complete break with the past, this report should be viewed with confidence, and is presented with the pride of Lagos State.

Schools

The school list in Lagos State was for the most part well maintained. However in the process of conducting the census, many new schools were brought to light, mostly a result of school splitting, rather than the establishment of new schools where there had not been one before. School splitting takes place when schools become too large, usually over 1,000 pupils. The school list will be audited and confirmed before the next data collection for the census in November 2012. Table 2.1 provides the details of the number of schools captured by level.

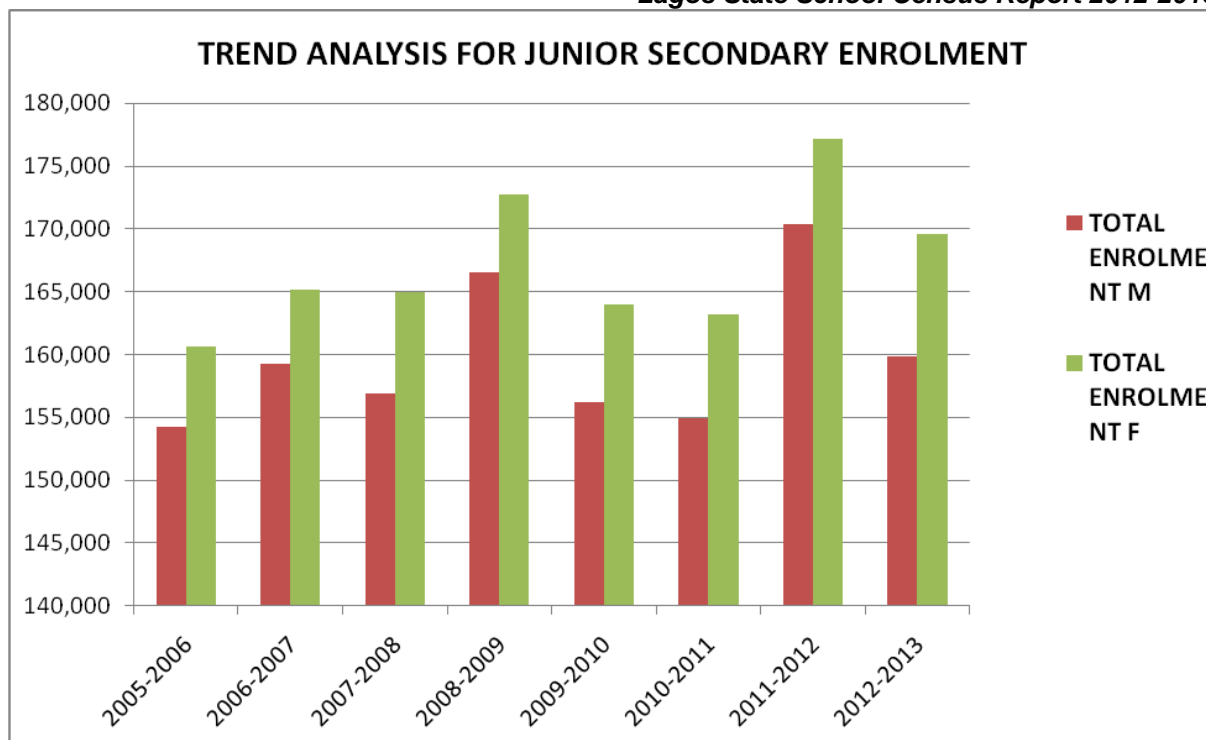

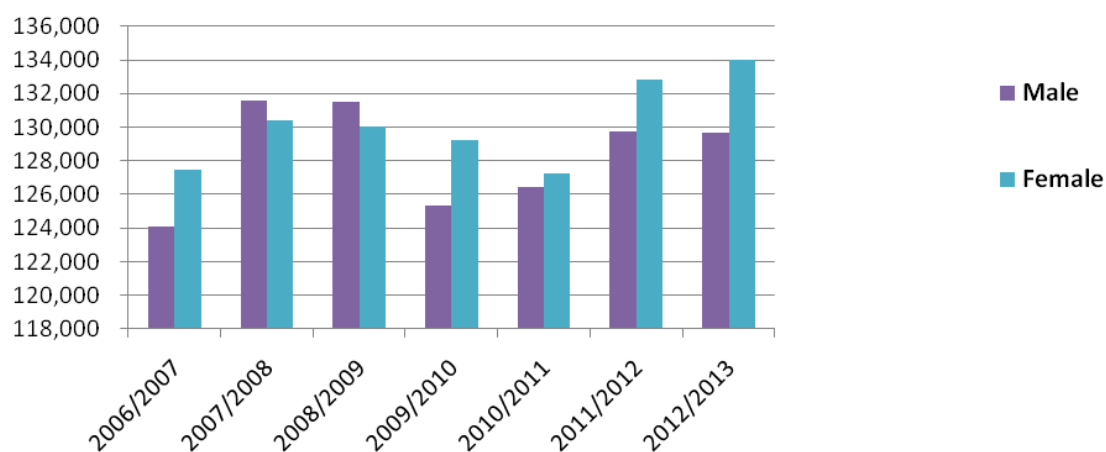

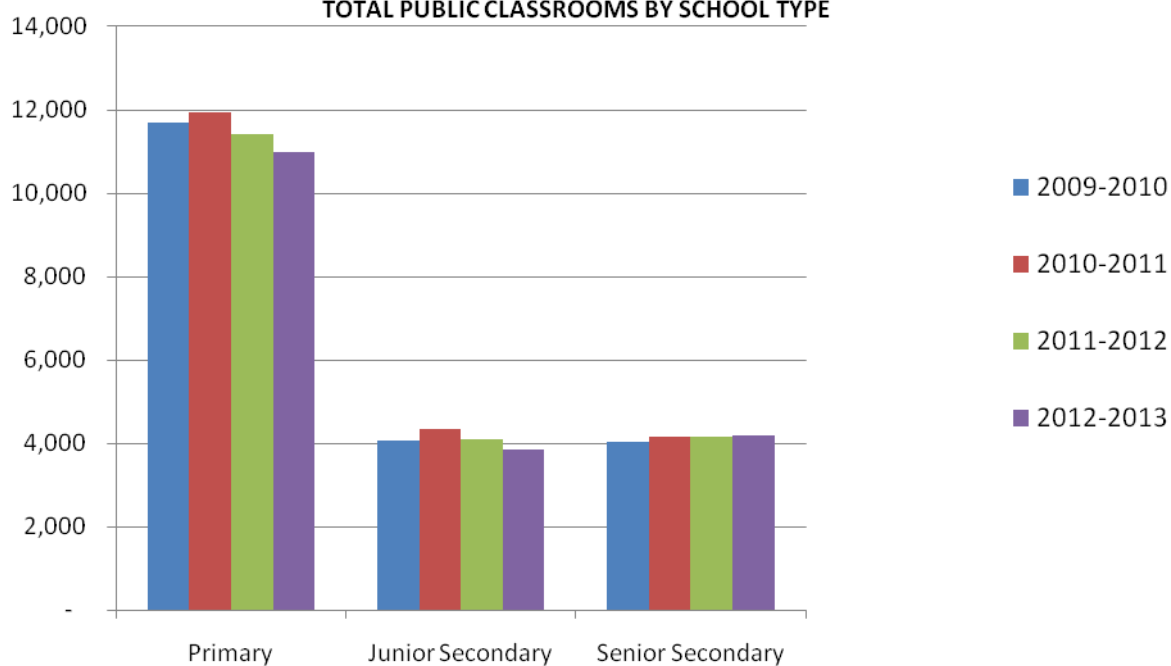
